SUNDAY 9th JUNE 2024 at 7pm in St Mary's Church, Brixham

Welcome to this Christian service and final event to mark the 80th Anniversary commemorations and celebrations of D-Day June 6th 1944.

It is now 80 years since Allied forces commenced the liberation of Europe. The successful liberation of Europe from Nazi tyranny, resulted in peace on a European continent riveted by centuries of warfare until 2022.

In 1939, Brixham was a small coastal fishing port with a population of around 8,000. Over 125 local inhabitants were killed during the War (1939-1945) with many more injured or suffered loss or bereavement. American forces departed our Breakwater slipway for the D-Day beaches landing on 6th June 1944. The War in Europe ended on 8th May 1945 (VE Day) with the surrender of Nazi Germany but would still continue in the Far East until Japan surrendered on the 2nd September 1945. It had cost 63 million lives.

This Church, and others in Brixham, were places of prayer and consolation for the bereaved and injured. Please remember those who served and sacrificed and never forget, we owe them so much for our peace and freedom.

When allied forces landed successfully on the Beaches of Normandy on 6th June 1944, it marked a turning point in world history. This evening 80 years after that great event, we are gathered here today to publicly celebrate the victory and recall the sacrifices made.

The Second World War (1939-1945) cost over 400,000 UK lives. That event scarred a generation and shaped our modern world. Since then, our world has seen remarkable changes. We have enjoyed great advances in science and technology, but continues to endured war and terrible suffering.

As the shadows of war grows ever stronger, we meet together in this Christian church to remember the fallen and pray for the more peaceful and prosperous world our fore-fathers sacrificed for.

ST MARY'S CHURCH BRIXHAM



St. Mary's is the ancient parish church of Brixham. The wooden Saxon church was succeeded by a Norman Church 14 feet wide and walls 28 inches thick now just within the columns of the North and South aisles.

The current building you see is an example of a new church commenced around 1435 built outside and over the earlier Norman edifice.

Outside, the historic graveyard contains over 8,000 known internments including 43 war graves from both World Wars.
